SECTION 4: First-aid measures

If inhaled

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

Following product recovery, flush area with water to remove residual contamination.

Never return spills to original containers for reuse. Contaminated absorbent material may pose the same hazards as the spilled product.
